

# CHAPTER 19: SCORING YOUR SSAT PRACTICE TEST

Your SSAT score is calculated by using a formula that cannot be directly applied to your practice tests. Therefore, it is impossible to provide a completely accurate score for your practice tests. Nevertheless, you'll understandably want to get an idea of how well you have performed.

Follow the steps described below to obtain a rough approximation of what your score on the actual SSAT might be. First, add up the number of questions you got right and the number of questions you got wrong. Questions left blank are worth zero points. Then, do the math, based on the following:

This is called your raw score. Next, take your raw score and look at the following chart, which approximates a conversion to a scaled score. A scaled score takes into account the range in difficulty level of the various editions of the test.

Again, while the following scores and percentiles are close approximations, they do not reflect the official scores and percentiles used on the SSAT. Among other contributing factors, your actual test score will take into account the group of students to whom you will be compared to on your test administration.

# **UPPER- AND MIDDLE-LEVEL SCORES**

Upper-level scores are based on a scale of 500–800. Middle-level scores are based on a scale of 440–710. Once you have looked up your scaled score, refer to the 50th Percentile score chart below: This will tell you the score at which equal numbers of students scored above and below you. With this information, you will be able to gauge how well you have done with respect to other students.

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## **ELEMENTARY-LEVEL SCORES**

Elementary-level test scores are based on a scale of 300–600. Once you have looked up your scaled score, refer to the 50th Percentile score chart below: That chart will tell you the score at which equal numbers of students scored above and below you. This way, you will be able to gauge how well you have done with respect to other students.
